

Why Study Philosophy at UMD?

Philosophy is for intellectual omnivores and ranges over the nature of morality through free will to unraveling the concepts of scientific disciplines such as biology, physics and psychology. Philosophy relies on careful analysis, rigorous argument, clear writing and disciplined imagination—approaches that transfer to virtually any endeavor.

PHILOSOPHY CURRICULUM

The undergraduate major provides an overview of most areas of philosophy, often in interaction with other disciplines. This prepares you to grasp information in its broader context. If you like, you can specialize in one of three broad areas of specialty among the faculty: **philosophy of science**, **cognitive studies** or **value theory**. Philosophy of science addresses questions about the nature of science and the content of specific theories. Cognitive studies focuses on the mind, using tools from linguistics, psychology, computer sciences and neuroscience. Value theory includes the philosophy of art, social and political philosophy and fundamental questions about morality.
