LISA FAGAN

LISA FAGAN is a choreographer, performer and theater maker based in New York City whose work has been dubbed "The High Weird" by critics. She is the director/ choreographer and a practicing member of the experimental performance collective CHILD, a company of 14 multidisciplinary artists. Recent: Nature Theater of Oklahomas's No President (dancer), HILMA (choreographer), June 2024 at Tony-award winning theater The Wilma, Open Throat (choreographer) at Little Island. Upcoming: Friday Night Rat Catchers, with collaborative partner Lena Engelstein, premiering Spring 2025 at New York Live Arts. Fagan's work has been presented in New York City by: New York Live Arts (Live Artery 2024), Baryshnikov Arts Center (BAC Open, Fall 2023), Prelude Festival, Immediate Medium, Mercury Store, LifeWorld, Target Margin (2019-20 Artist in Residence with Catherine Brookman), HERE Arts, Bard College (Choreographer: Promenade by Maria Irene Fornes, Dir. Morgan Green), Exponential Festival (2019-20 Exponential Fellow), Mabou Mines, Ars Nova, Movement Research, Gibney, Roulette, The 92nd Street Y and others. She collaborates with artists across disciplines supporting their shows choreographically and as movement director, including Alex Tatarsky's Sad Boys in Harpy Land (Abrons) and Lisa Clair's Willa's Authentic Self (Mitu580). She has taught physical practice, choreography and dance related forms at Barnard College, The Celebration Barn, Gibney and others. On-screen choreography credits include the TV pilot THESE DAYS, premiering at Sundance 2021.

LENA ENGELSTEIN

LENA ENGELSTEIN is a dancer, performer and choreographer. Her work has been dubbed "The High Weird" by critics and lauded as "subtly campy and hilariously queer" by the Brooklyn Rail. Recent Choreography/Direction: *Friday Night Rat Catchers* at New York Live Arts (forthcoming March 2025) and *Deepe Darknesse* at New York Live Arts' Live Artery 2024 with collaborator Lisa Fagan. Engelstein is a member of the interdisciplinary collective CHILD whose performance 1-800-3592-113592, directed by Fagan, was described as a"hypnotic dance-theater acid trip" (Helen Shaw, The New Yorker: Best Theater of 2024). Engelstein currently works with choreographer Joanna Kotze and musician Teeny Liberson's band Lou Tides. Recent Performance credits: Alexa West, Barnett Cohen, Brendan Drake, Faye Driscoll, Falcon Dance, Isa Spector, Jo Warren, Owen Prum + Lili Dekker, Miguel Alejandro Castillo and Third Rail Company's *Then She Fell* (company member, 2019-2020). She has taught at SUNY Brockport, Colorado Mesa University and The Field Center. Lena holds a B.A. in Mathematics from Colorado College.


HANNAH MITCHELL

HANNAH MITCHELL is an actor, theater-maker and educator whose work springs from the improvisational arts of clown and bouffon. She is a founding member of the experimental performance collective CHILD, whose creative output "so insistently defies human logic (Helen Shaw, The New Yorker)," and of the clown company WüfPak. Her projects take inspiration from auctioneer chant, consciousness alteration, garlic, country music, local news, Greek tragedy, cyborgs and trad wives to explore sincerity, open-ended forms, family systems and gender roles under capitalism/patriarchy. Hannah has performed at many venues around New York City including The Public Theater, The Brick Theater, Park Ave Armory, Collapsable Hole, Lincoln Center, Life World, New Ohio Theatre, HERE Arts Center, Target Margin Theater and Brooklyn Comedy Collective, among others. Regionally her work has been seen at The Philadelphia Fringe Festival, Princeton University and abroad at The Edinburgh Fringe Festival.
