DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In her book *Letters to a Young Artist*, playwright and actor Anna Deavere Smith writes: "Art should take what is complex and render it simply. It takes a lot of skill, human understanding, stamina, courage, energy, and heart to do that." The choreographers and dancers of UMoves have spent the past several months on a journey to arrive here this evening. Choreographers have skillfully led movement explorations with dancers contributing by offering creative solutions and asking additional questions. The process started in the fall, with a faculty panel selecting choreographers, and choreographers in turn selecting dancers at an audition. Then the work begins: the discoveries in the creative process, in collaboration with the dancers and the designers.

The dance faculty works closely with the choreographers and dancers along the way, offering suggestions and feedback based in years of experience with the dance field. By now, these dances have been researched, revised, and rehearsed. As Deavere Smith suggests, "Ideas are a dime a dozen; to make them real takes consistent, persistent application of energy toward that idea." Enjoy watching what these artists discovered and what they have made real through their dancing.
